Empowering Oklahoma Museums

First Step for Oklahoma Arts Council -Arts and Cultural Sector ARPA Funding Deadline is October 31

IN SPRING 2023, a transformational \$10 million investment of state American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding for Oklahoma's arts and cultural sector was overwhelmingly advanced by the Oklahoma State

Brenda

Legislature and approved by the Governor. It was designed to boost the rebuilding of the sector across all 77 Oklahoma counties while catapulting it forward as an asset for developing creative workforce and strengthening the economy. These are one-time grants available to 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations with arts programming. More information can be found here, including a link to the Fluxx grant system once it is live on October 2.

OMA encourages ALL Oklahoma 501c3 museums to complete the first step of eligibility. The program guidelines can be found here. OMA recommends that you do not predetermine if your organization might not be eligible, complete the eligibility application for a determination.

The very important first step for all organizations applying is the verification of eligibility, even if you have received a grant from OAC before, you have to create a user account with fluxx. You must complete the eligibility application between October 2 - October 31, 2023 by 5:00pm CT. If eligibility is verified, then the application period for the actual grant is November 1, 2023 – December 15, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.

Oklahoma Historical Society Oklahoma Heritage Preservation Grant Program Open for Applications

Deadline to Apply November 1

THE OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL SOCIETY (OHS) has opened applications for the 2023/2024 grant cycle of the Oklahoma Heritage Preservation Grant Program. This grants-in-aid program will set aside \$500,000 to award grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$20,000 to municipal, county or tribal governments and not-for-profit historical organizations, as well as the support groups for these entities. All not-for-profit applicants must be registered and in good standing with the Oklahoma secretary of state.

The grants will be specific to four categories: collections, exhibits, programs and capacity building. The online application process will close on Tuesday, November 1, 2023,

at 5 p.m. For applicants wishing to receive optional draft application feedback, draft applications will be due Friday, October 6, 2022.

Award announcements will be made in late January 2024. All organizations that apply must have a strategic plan to be considered for a grant. If your organization does not have a strategic plan, you are eligible to apply for a grant to fund strategic plan development.

The 2023/2024 grant cycle marks the 4th grant cycle that OHS has offered Oklahoma Heritage Preservation Grants. "This program is an amazing opportunity for local and tribal governments and historical organizations, providing funds to move forward on projects that may not otherwise be possible." 



Fundraising Tips

Chad Barger with Productive Fundraising

THE FIRST SENTENCE of a fundraising appeal letter should definitely not begin with "On behalf of the Board of Directors of ABC Organization." It should start with the story you're going to tell. But the first sentence should also not be, "Let me tell you a story about something that happened last week." You need to go right into the story with something attention-getting. While "facts and statistics tell, but stories sell" is traditionally a sales adage, it still applies in the nonprofit sector as well. Ideally, there's a place for facts and statistics later in our letter, or we might save this information for an annual report. The story should always come first in appeals since it will pull readers in and give them the "why" they should support your organization.


